Vision/Aim

To empower youths to become leaders and establish a new society based on the principles of freedom, equality, justice and peace

Objectives

- 1) To promote quality critical thinking and creativity of youth
- 2) To increase youth and community collaboration on peace, democracy, human rights and environment.
- 3) To corporate with ethnic youths on building a federal union with equality and self-determination
- 4) To increase youths participation in national and political decision making
- 5) To promote Pa-O literature and culture

History Background

The Pa-O Youth Organization (PYO) was formed in 1947 at Htaton, Mon State by general secretary Khun Kyaw Sein, Pa-O National Organization (PNO) 1976 (Member of Parliament) Chairperson Khun Pan Sein and 1960 Htaton Member of Parliament Khun Ba Shwe.

On Dec 4th 1950, over 10,000 Pa-O people demonstrated for democracy on General Aung San Road in Taunggyi. On Dec 4th 1966 General San Thein led the Pa-O National Liberation Organization against the military dictatorship system.

Based on the historic Dec 4th date, we reformed the Pa-O Youth Organization in Dec 4th 1998 with Pa-O people, youths and monks who arrived to Chiangmai, Thailand at Wat Naung Kham temple. At that time, in Myanmar, there were some Pa-O national organizations already set up. However, there were no youth organizations set up in order to struggle for national, political and social development. That is why; we reformed the Pa-O Youth Organization (PYO).
